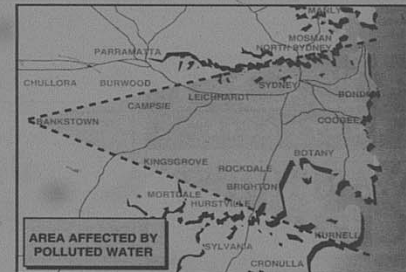

1.5m told: Don't drink from taps

UP TO 1.5 million residents across a large area of Sydney were today warned not to drink tap water following the discovery of two parasites in the city's supply.

Hundreds of Sydneysiders rang a hotline today after the Health Department extended the affected area to a total of 157 suburbs.

The health alert urging people to boil their water has been extended to a triangular area stretching east of Bankstown and Silverwater, south of the Harbour and all areas north of the Georges River.

Suburbs now affected in southern Sydney include Rockdale, Kogarah, Hurstville and Mascot.

The health alert also encompasses residents in the western and south-western suburbs of Strathfield, Bankstown, Canterbury, Burwood and Concord.

Sydney Water advised people to boil tap water for one minute and allow it to cool before drinking.

Hot tap water is suitable for bathing and washing kitchenware, but Sydney Water advises against rinsing in cold water.

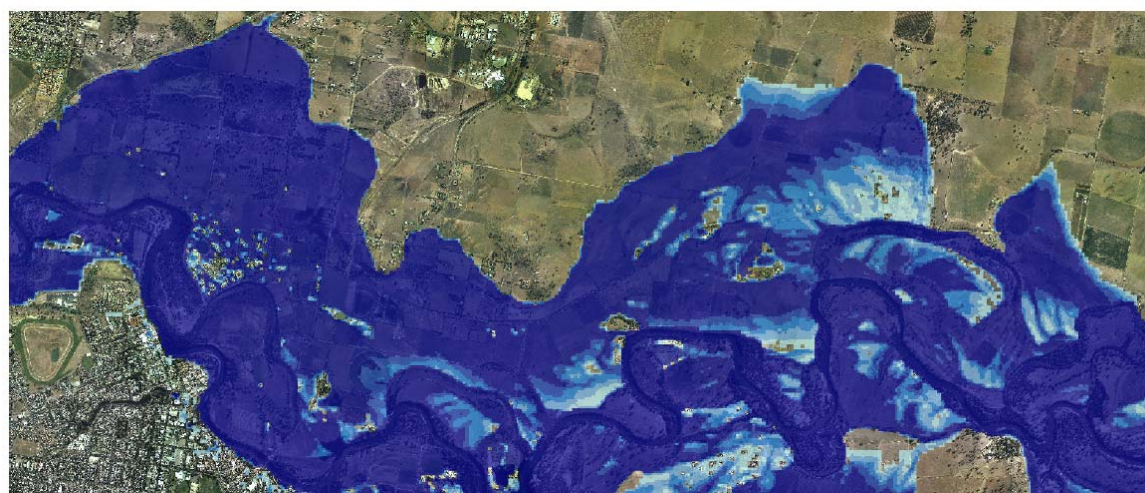


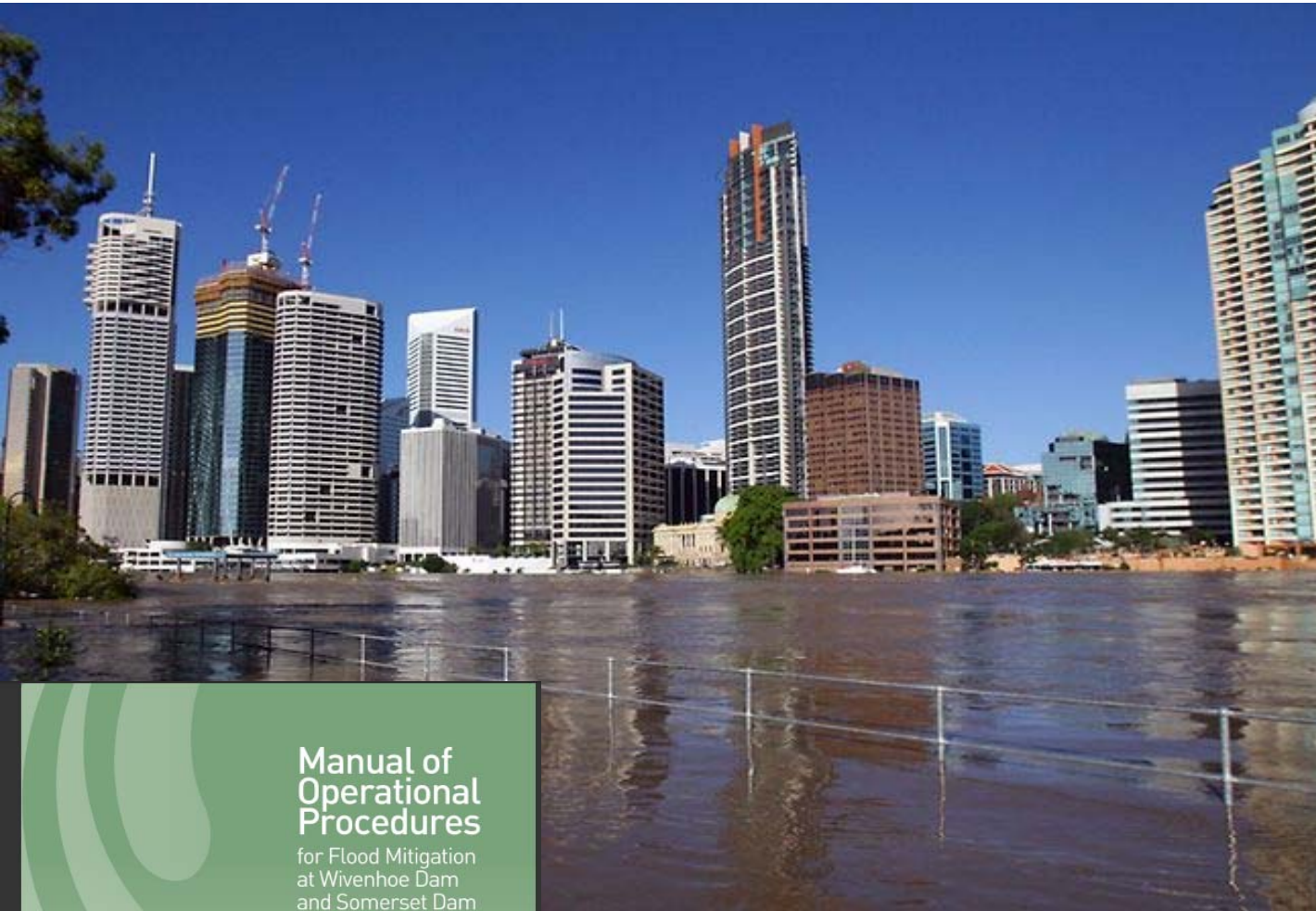

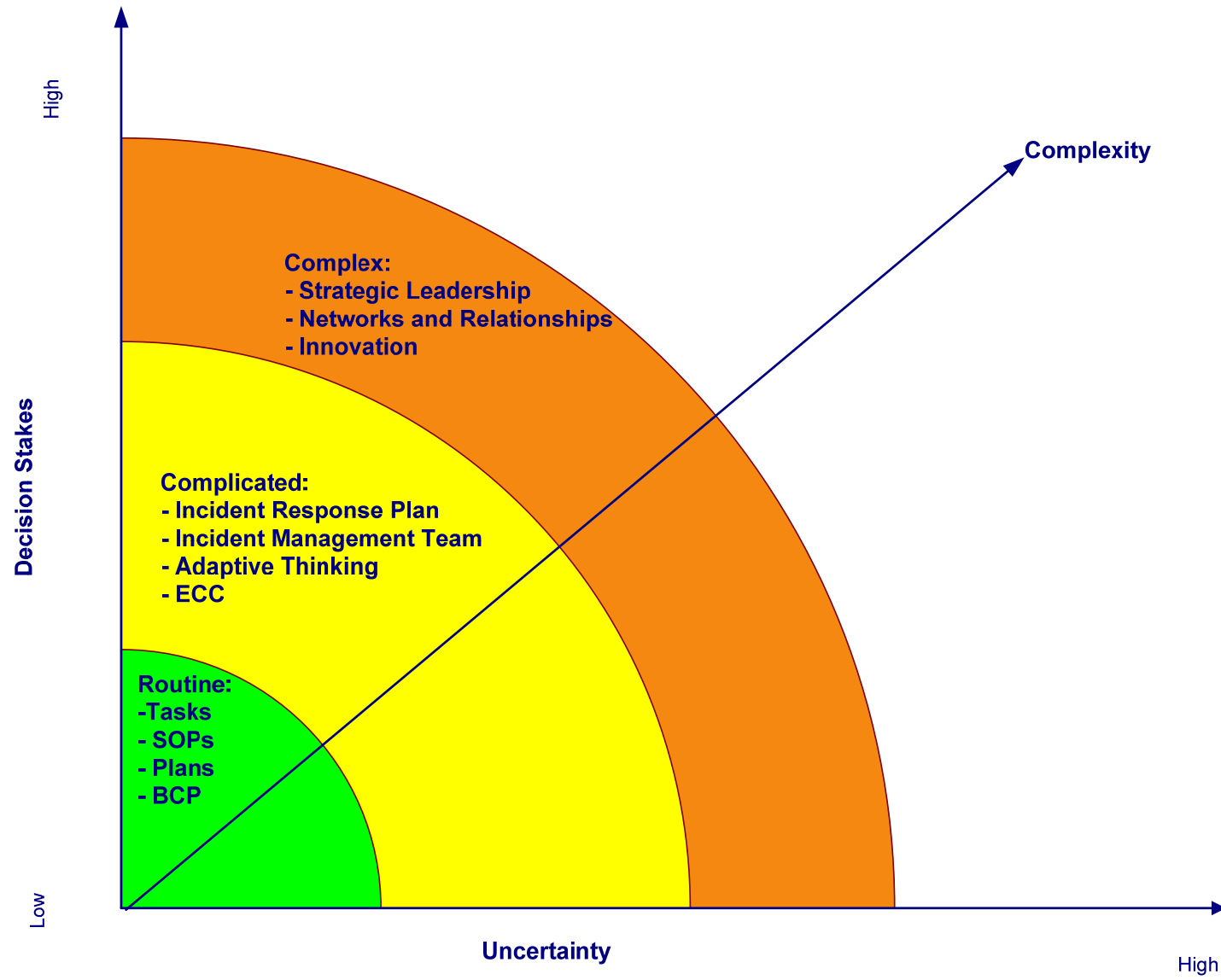


Resilience Indicators



- Underlying resilience issues often relate more to the **softer, less tangible aspects of an organisation**, such as its culture, leadership and vision. For example, qualities fundamental to enabling different parts of the organisation to work together to achieve a common objective include:
 - good communication;
 - **relationships within the organisation**;
 - relationships with key customers and stakeholders;
 - trust;
 - a shared vision and priorities across the organisation.
