## Cooperation within the sector


#### **Mutual Aid Agreement**

- Inter-company borrowing of emergency equipment to supplement company's own stocks during big incidents
- Plus: staff, transportation & filling points
- With this MAA the sector can guarantee emergency drinking water (3 L pp/pd):
  - For the 4 biggest cities
  - In order to cover each flooding-scenario
  - In order to cover a nucleairor chemical fall-out





# Cooperation with crisispartners



#### Security regions:

- Municipalities
- Fire department
- **Ambulance**

- Regional inspectors: crisis excercises; risk analysis...
- EPA-d

#### 2. National Coördinator for Counterterrorism

Counterterrorism Alert System

- Analysing intelligence on conceivable threats
- Combined training on conceivable scenarios
- Tuning measures

# National agreement between drinking water companies, police- & security regions on:

- Multi disciplinary trainings
- Tuning crisisplans & crisis organisations
- Deploying staff to operational & policy crisisteams
- Deployment of emergency drinking water: security; disabled / hospitals
- Use of C2000
- Protection of critical locations
